

Dear sir,

In view of the fact that Tarrant County had a full time Negro field man who did a very efficient job with the farm labor program and since we enjoyed splendid cooperation from the County Extension Personnel in the program in charge I feel that the 1946 program will be a bigger and better one if;

1. we have the reemployment of the full time Negro field man.
2. We can have a revision of the report making system so that A and M college may know first hand the part that Negro agents and Field men are playing in the program.
3. Clerical help- full or part time.
4. Compensation for field expense for Negro agents when incurred while working directly with the farm labor program.

These recommendations are not necessarily solutions to problems because the farm labor program in Tarrant county worked smoothly last year but at a sacrifice on the part of the Negro agents. I fear that even tho' 86 per cent of the laborers sent to farmers were sent through our office that A and M was given the intelligence that the other county personnel did the work because all reports went in from the office and we were merely required to report our activities to them and of course to you for your records. If the work had been reported through other channels in its entirety I fear that there would have been duplications and probably conflict.

We have enjoyed the relationship as supervisor over our County program and do look forward to doing our best to make the 1946 program even better. We offer you any assistance or cooperation desired.

Received your note and sorry that I was out on your recent visit to the county. You will find the Negro Extension offices located on 4th and Jones Sts. in the Old City and County hospital room 18, on your next visit.


TO ALL COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENTS


