TO ALL COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENTS

Dear Agent:

We have been assured by the manufacturers that they will have an ample supply of methoxychlor in the state by June 1. Until such time, if methoxychlor is not available, we suggest that you tell the farmers to go right ahead with the DDT spraying as they have in the past. We do hope to change to the methoxychlor treatment before the end of the year, but we certainly cannot neglect our parasite control until the material is available. We, therefore, feel that you will be perfectly safe in telling all concerned to use the DDT exactly as they have in the past.

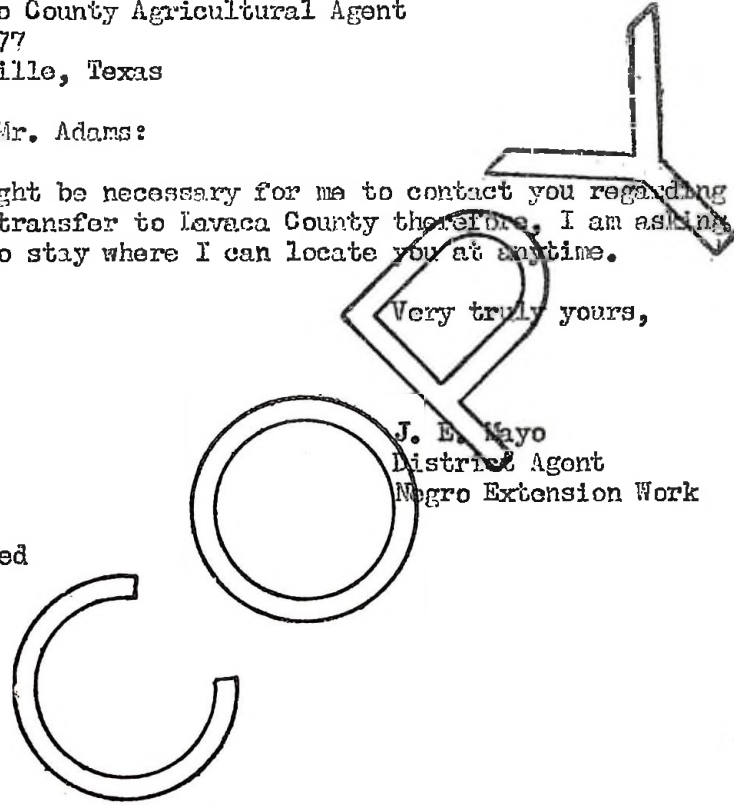
