

TO ALL COUNTY AGENTS:

Dear Agents:

During seasons like the present one, when we are having lots of rainfall and heavy dews, there is a great deal of danger from stomach worm infestation. Moisture and warm weather provide ideal conditions for the reproduction of this parasite.


Sub-Station No. 14 at Sonora recommends the following schedule for the control of stomach worms in sheep: Drench with phenothiazine in the spring (shearing time is an excellent time); feed phenothiazine and salt (10 pounds of salt to one pound of phenothiazine) during the summer months; drench with phenothiazine again in the fall (when the lambs are weaned or at shipping time). The sheep should be watched carefully during a season such as this for symptoms of stomach worm infestation and additional drenching practiced as needed.

A pale watery appearance of the membranes around the eyes and lips is usually a typical symptom. This is usually accompanied by a loss of weight or emaciation. Scouring is also a common indicator of stomach worms. In advanced cases bottle jaw (a swelling on the underside of the jaws and neck) and eating of dirt or other material are common signs of this condition.

Lambs should be watched carefully as this parasite will do damage to young animals more quickly than to adults. Adults have had time to build up more resistance and it will take longer to produce the harmful effects.

Every effort should be made to guard against loss from this cause.



Dear Extension Folks:

It appears now that there is no particular rush for getting your requisitions for TVA phosphate in to me before late June or July. The reason for this change is the fact that I first told you that there was no particular rush about it since at that time, there was no fertilizer set up for you before July 1, then some of the older counties dropped out because of the graduated payment plan, there was more and more fertilizer available. This gave me the idea that possibly if you could get your requisitions and forms in to me in time that you could get shipment of TVA phosphate before July 1, and thus we would not lose some of the state allocation of this material which must be accepted before July 1.

I am sorry to have bothered you about the changes in urgency of getting these forms in, but the latest situation is that if you will get your requisitions in to me some time in June or July, you can expect shipment around late July or early August. This, however, is dependent upon a congressional appropriation to continue the best demonstration work in the TVA.


TO ALL EXTENSION PERSONNEL:



SOUTHERN DISTRICT 4-H CLUB CAMP

The 4th annual southern district 4-H camp convened on Guadalupe College campus Seguin, Texas July 12-14, 1949. This was the first joint camp with boys and ~~girl~~ girls. The attendance of the camp is as follows: 92 4-H club boys, 3 sponsors, 16 county agricultural agents, and 53 4-H club girls, sponsors, and county home demonstration agents. Total attendance 164. Each county in the southern district having a county agricultural agent was present except Falls county. This is one of the best records that have been established. Representation by counties having 4-H club boys present is as follows: Bastrop ~~1~~/4, Brazos 5, Burleson 1, Caldwell 1, Colorado 6, Dewitt 3, Guadalupe 11, Fayette none, Ft. Bend 6, Milam 3, Melennan 2, Lavaca 2, Robertson 4, Travis 11, and Wharton 24. The ~~4~~ counties having sponsors were Travis, Wharton, and Guadalupe. The 2 district agents for the southern district, Miss. Garrett and Mr. Mayo were also in attendance. Mr. W. C. David, State leader of Negro Extension Work, visited the camp. Mrs. P. R. Brown, Supervisor of Negro County Home Demonstration Work also visited the camp.

The committees for the encampment were made up of the Extension agents. The 1st evening of the camp was devoted to camp organization and recreation. Some of the boys went swimming in the Seguin Colored swimming pool. The opening night program consisted of welcome. Response was given by Mr. J. E. Mayo.

The 2nd day of the camp was opened with all boys going swimming before breakfast. After breakfast there were demonstrations in welding, leather crafts, and rope making. Mr. B. N. Rector, white county agri. agent of Guadalupe county spoke and demonstrated 4-H club records. Two Texas highway patrolmen spoke on public safety.

Three Seguin Transit Buses and some of the agents carried the entire delegation to San Antonio on an educational tour. Most of the time was spent in Brackenridge park. The following evening there was a candlelighting ceremony.

The third day of the camp was devoted to recreation, glass etching, leather craft, caponizing, seed identification, and a wildlife demonstration and lecture by Mr. R. E. Callender, Wildlife Specialist of Texas Extension Service.

The district agent appointed 5 county agricultural agents to work as a committee for 4-H district council organization. 5 county home demonstrations agent were also added to this committee to make plans for a joint camp in 1950. No place was designated to hold the camp for 1950. A place of meeting will have to be decided upon later. The total amount of money received for registration fee was \$471.00. Total expenses were \$442.74. Balance remaining in treasurer \$28.26
