Dear Mr. Williams:

I am writing concerning the boar pig that we received in Madison county in connection with the Cow-Hog-Hen Program. For some unknown reason, this pig has broken out with a severe case of skin disease. It is probably the worst that I have ever seen. I doubt if he will ever recover. However, if he does, I don't think it will be safe to breed healthy sows to him.

This boar was delivered by Mr. M. I. Helmuth, of Bellville, Texas on December 10, 1942. He appeared to be in good condition at that time. About a month later this condition appeared. No other hog on the place has shown symptoms of such disease before or since.

Please advise me what to do. I am afraid that we won't be able to use this boar in serving the Sears gilts that were placed with the club boys.

I am very sorry that this has happened, but it was not at all the fault of the owner. The pig has had the best of care and has not been exposed to such a case since he was delivered.

Each year for the past 2 years we have held a cured meat exhibit at the Houston City Auditorium, Houston, Texas. These demonstrations have been rated as the largest exhibits of home cured meat on record anywhere. The programs and demonstrations that have been held in connection with the exhibits are designed to stimulate this type of work among Negro farmers, as a part of a live-at-home program outlined by the extension service for Negroes at Prairie View State College.

Last year we ran a souvenir program, a sample of which we are inclosing, which was distributed to about 3000 people who visited the show. This work was done by students studying printing at Prairie View College. All the profit from this work went to the student who built up the program which enabled him to stay in school.

We are hoping that we can build up a souvenir program for the 1942 show by the same method. 
Dear Agent:

The Southern District Annual Cured Meat Show will be held at the Houston City Auditorium, March 30-31, and April 1. March 30 will be used to put up the exhibit which will be judged, March 31.

The programs will follow the same general plan used last year which will include the luncheon. The same contribution each agent made last year will be expected again this year. I hope I will not have to call your attention to the last item again. Each agent will exhibit the equivalent of 5 hogs; jowls, butts, shoulders, bacons, loins, and hams. 



## FEEDING RATIONS

Compiled by S. T. Toney, Negro County Agri. Agent

A good supply of green grazing in the permanent or temporary pasture, silage and hay (well cured) is necessary in the better care of livestock and poultry. The following rations work well with good grazing on green grass and other, planted grazings, including oats.

### Milk Cows

100 lbs. ground ear corn, 100 lbs. wheat bran, 100 lbs. cotton seed meal, 6 lbs. oyster shell flour, 4 lbs alfalfa leaf meal, 6 lbs. sweet potatoes. Mineral mixture 3 lbs. steam bone meal 1 lb. salt over which a small amount of cottonseed meal has been sprinkled, in a separate box under the shed and protected from the weather.

Feed 3 lbs of this mixture to each gallon of milk cow gives.

### Fattening Hogs

Use Self Feeder. Fill large compartment with grain such as corn, hagar, maize. Fill small compartment with the following protien supplement mixture: Cotton seed meal 45 lbs, Tankage 45 lbs. Alfalfa leaf meal 10 lbs. Bone Meal 2 lbs. Salt 1 lb.

In the absence of self feeder feed 9 parts of grain to 1 part of the above protien supplement mixture. Green grazing.

### Laying hens

In mash hopper use: Corn meal 16 lbs. Meat scrap 6½ lbs. Bran 1 lb. Middlings or shorts 1 lb.

Scratch feed: (fed in deep litter to cause hens to exercise) equal parts of cracked corn and wheat.

Provide plenty of green grazing

### Baby chicks

Start feeding at 36 hours age on chicks. Keep the following mash before the chicks at all times, in open hoppers.

Ground yellow corn 270 lbs., shorts 75 lbs. bran 50 lbs. alfalfa leaf meal 25 lbs. meat scrap 50 lbs, dried milk 25 lbs. salt 5 lbs cod liver oil or sardine oil 5 lbs.

Fresh sour milk clabber or butter milk may be used instead of the dried milk. When chicks receive sunshine cod liver oil may be omitted. Cockerels should be fed all mash until marketed.

### Fattening chickens

Soft feed: finely ground corn 12 lbs. wheat bran 4 lbs. wheat middlings 4 lbs. meat scrap 1 lb.

### Brood sows

When dry: shelled corn 10 lbs. ground oats 10 lbs. bran 5 lbs.

Just before and just after farrowing: ground oats 10 lbs. bran 10 lbs. skim milk (1 qt. to 1 lb. grain or tankage or fish meal) 2 lbs.

After pigs are 2 weeks old: shelled corn 10 lbs. ground oats 10 lbs. bran 10 lbs. tankage or fish meal 10 lbs. or skim milk ( 1qt. to 1 lb. grain) 3 lbs.

For nursing pigs (to be placed in creeps) ground oats (to be hulled or sifted out) 1 lb. wheat middlings 1 lb.

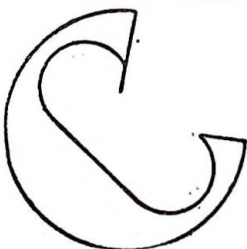
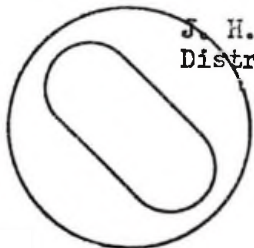
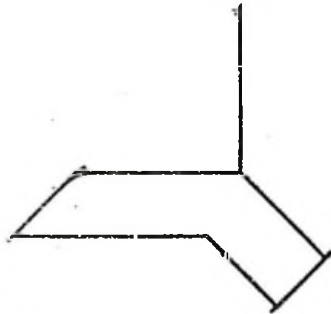
