During the past ten days I have managed to get around and check on the "Sears" pigs and in nearly every case I find them doing excellently well.

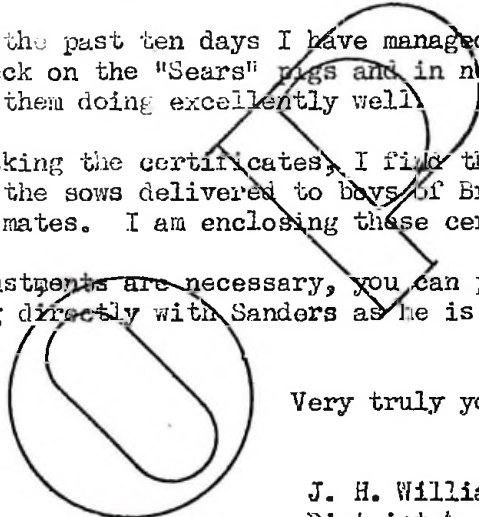
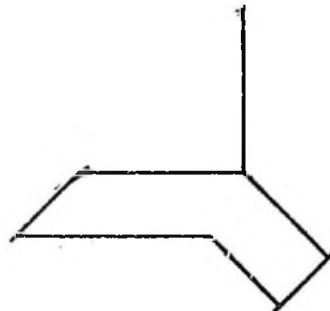
In checking the certificates, I find that the boar and two of the sows delivered to boys of Brazos County are litter mates. I am enclosing these certificates.

to manufacture celluloid buttons to be worn by VICTORY DEMONSTRATORS. Mr. Weaver quotes the following prices in his letter of March 24 to this office: 50 buttons \$1.95; 100 - \$2.25; 250 - \$4.45; 500 - \$8.15; 100 - \$15.45. Orders should be sent directly to the above address.

In making the above arrangements with Mr. Weaver, we agreed to advise you of the prices and where the buttons could be obtained. Mr. Weaver suggests that it will be cheaper if a check can accompany the order. In this way you will not have the postage and COD charges which you will have if the order is not accompanied by a check or money order.

Since we are unable to give Mr. Weaver any assurance of any number, he will not stock these buttons in large quantities, but will try to keep ahead of the orders. The time required for filling orders will depend on how they come into him. However, he promises full cooperation and as speedy delivery as can be given under the circumstances -- a week's time should be the maximum.

We would suggest that the person in charge of the order for your county send his order at the earliest possible time.

We hope that this button will stimulate the VICTORY DEMONSTRATION; that those wearing the buttons will take every opportunity to inform others of its meaning, and that in this way many more VICTORY DEMONSTRATORS may be enrolled.


