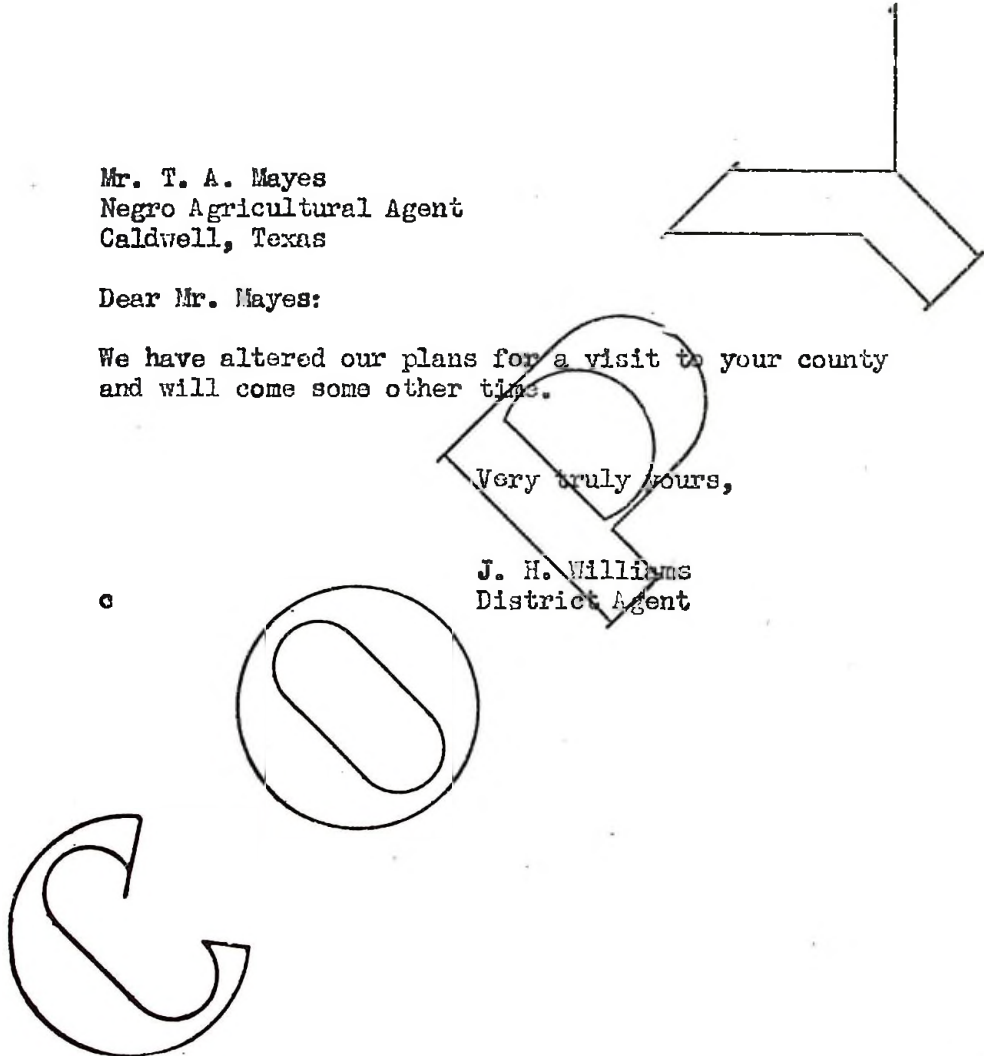

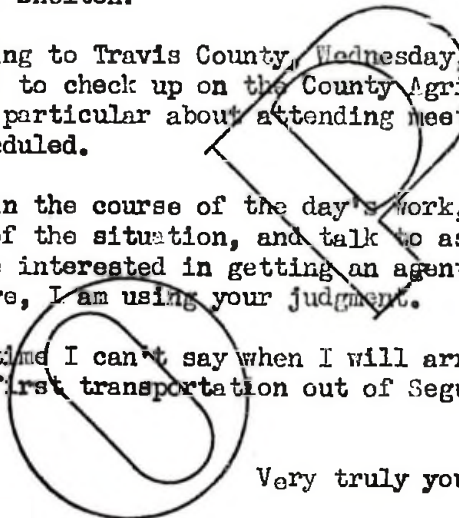
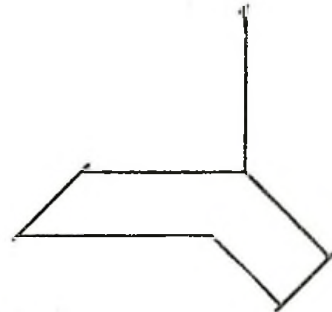
I hope, in the course of the day's work, to get a true picture of the situation, and talk to as many people who should be interested in getting an agent as to who these people are, I am using your judgment.
