Dear Co-workers:

The order to mobilize all the boys in your county from ten through twenty years of age to assist in war production needs will reach you sooner than you anticipate.

How many boys are there in your county from ten through twenty years? How many from twenty-one through thirty who are unmarried? Do they live in rural communities or in towns with a population less than 2,000? This is the information you must secure. Your last chance to secure this information and other information about your county will come during the sugar rationing program.
