However, in order that I be able to leave my accounts in good order, an requesting that you see that what ever steps as are necessary be taken to make available to me my accumilated savings with the Teacher Retirement System. It would seem that this should entail very little effort, as the stipulations provide that an agent may recieve his savings upon the condition that he leaves the Extension Service. Am sure this can be done in the right way.

Mould like also to be assured that a job with the Service be tentatively open to be after the war. I like Seguin and would like to be stationed here again, if possible, providing of course that care has been exercised by the local agent succeeding me to preserve a wholesome regard for the work here.

It is to be remembered that this letter is conditioned upon the presumption that I am accepted in the army, which, to date, is not the case.
