Dear Mr. King:

In reply to your very interesting and enlightening letter of February 1st, I regret the delay in answering the same sooner, however, occurrences in and about the time this letter should have been answered justifies in some measure at least, this delay.

The entire text of your letter is quite interesting, but especially the 4th and 5th paragraphs. You may rest assure that since credit is the major bottleneck of our work, we shall take full advantage of this opportunity.

Your letter came in just as we were arranging a series of meetings, which incidentally consumed the major portion of the month of February, and fortunately, Mr. Washington reached Texas just in time to participate in one half of these meetings. Our training work is done in small groups, and Mr. Washington had the opportunity to explain his work to each of the groups in the Northern District, to talk personally with the agents concerning their credit problems, and as we moved across to Districts to make personal contact with many secretaries, and clients, the work with the secretaries was very important in my opinion, as many of them needed "softening up."

I regret very much that Mr. Washington was not able to attend the meetings in the Southern District, and may I suggest that he be allowed to return to Texas at an early date to make this highly important contribution. If we know thirty days in advance of his itinerary, we will be glad to arrange a series of meetings similar to those conducted in the Northern half of the state, out of which

In answer to your question about withdrawal of funds: All that is necessary is for you to request of this office proper forms for withdrawal. However, we would like to point out to you, that withdrawal constitutes a cancellation of all claims against the Retirement System for any benefits. You have reported thirteen years of eligible prior service with a probable retirement annuity of about \$196.84 each year from prior service alone from retirement until death. You could retire after you had taught at least twenty years, for which credit is allowable. We think this is well worth your consideration.
