In answer to your question about withdrawal of funds: All that is necessary is for you to request of this office proper forms for withdrawal. However, we would like to point out to you, that withdrawal constitutes a cancellation of all claims against the Retirement System for any benefits. You have reported thirteen years of eligible prior service with a probable retirement annuity of about \$196.84 each year from prior service alone from retirement until death. You could retire after you had taught at least twenty years, for which credit is allowable. We think this is well worth your consideration.
