Realizing the necessity of increased food and feed for war needs and home consumption, the plan of work for 1942 with the 1,101 Negro farms in the county, consisted mainly of a "live at home" program with both adult and 4-H farmers.

Demonstrations of such were conducted in seventeen communities consisting of farm gardens, corn, grain sorghums, syrup cane, hogs, poultry, beef and dairy cattle, alfalfa, and pecans.

Reports from 15 of the 17 communities show 268 demonstrators, 410 cooperators and others, who have been reached through the Extension Service, who produced 578 gardens with an average of 5 vegetables the year-round; 540 hogs for home butchering; 39 hogs totaling 7,660 lbs. sold to market; 136 beef cattle totaling 72,080 lbs. sold; 13,012 bu. corn produced; 2940 bu. sweet potatoes; 110 bu. dried peas and beans; 142 tons hay; approximately, 50 tons grain sorghum heads; 3 tons kershaw and pumpkin; 120 native pecan trees and sprouts budded and grafted; and an increase of 3,440 laying hens.

While assisting the farmers in the above productions, 115 meetings were held at result and method demonstrations, checking results of improved practices and methods being used, and showing farmers new practices, with a total attendance of 3,926.

A ten day Civilian Protection School was finished at Prairie View, August 24th to September 2nd. After returning to the county, 13 meetings were held in as many communities in the county, where information was given on war gases and protection against same; Incendiary Bombs, and how to treat them; Black outs and general civilian morale.

Approximately, 775 attended the meetings.


