
Dear Sir:

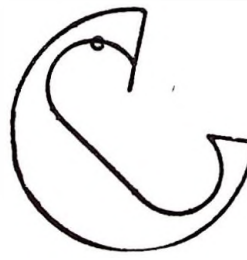
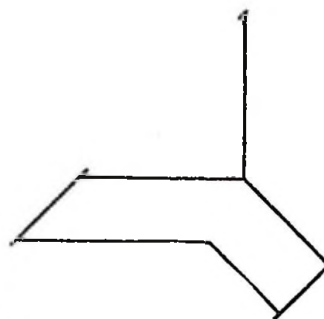
Dear Mr. Richards:






I checked up on both of these cases over long distance with the white county agents and we decided it would be best to make these replacements at this time so as to keep the program on schedule for next year.

TO EACH STAFF MEMBER

The following suggested procedure is forwarded to you so that you may have time to make a memorandum of your suggestions previous to the November 23 staff conference at which time we will review these plans.

1. Mrs. Pauline Brown will have charge of all home demonstration annual reports.
2. Mr. J. H. Williams will have charge of all statistical reports for agricultural agents.
3. Mr. H. S. Estelle will have charge of all narratives for agricultural agents.
4. The general chairman will be responsible for the work schedule. The entire force is requested to curtail all other duties and devote all time to making annual reports.
5. A report clerk will work right along with the general chairman starting December 10. The secretaries from both offices will work directly with the general chairman in checking in all reports. The general chairman will open and allocate the material to the general chairmen to have charge of the dept.
6. The general chairman will write all letters of transmittal in sending out materials and requests for additional materials. (add Gen. Sec.)
7. Complete checking for errors by December 15.
8. Check MS-21 for variance in pages so that district agents might check them and transfer to checker board sheets.
9. Same map colors will be used - agricultural agents, blue; home demonstration agents, red; both agents, red and blue; counties where population justifies agents, yellow.

Dear Mr. Williams:

I have just received some added information relative to my draft status which clarifies the facts I told you of yesterday. Mr. Paul B. Muller, Druggist at Richmond, whom I told you about who had agreed to see the board members relative to my classification, stated that he contacted the chairman of the board, Mr. P. E.
