Irene Tompkins of Wyatt Chapel community bought 50 New Hampshire with her prize money she received lasy year from her demonstration in 1950 and plan to buy more chicks in March and continue her demonstration.

Lillian Muse of Prairie View community is continuing her demonstration by planning to buy 100 White Leghorns in February.

Adult Poultry Production

The women are planning to buy baby chicks in March all those who havn't already bought them. Mrs. L. V. Jones of Hempstead community bought her chicks this month and have some coming in February. She 200 chicks now and looking for 200 more next month. She is raising them for egg production.

Mrs. C. M. Tompkins of Laneview community and Mrs. Irene Bragg of Harper community are planning to go into the Broiler growing business in the next 2 years. They have started planning now for a 3000 broiler unit. Mrs. Bragg has started with her planning by first to install an electric pump for her well.

"Getting The Soil Ready to Plant"

Method demonstrations were given this month to home demonstration clubs on "Getting the soil ready for planting". Budgeting the family's income these days is a "Must" in order to stretch it as far as possible still live comfortable. Food budgeting is really a "Must" if the family eat according to the Texas Food Standard and it can be done if a garden is planned.

Emphasis was given on making your own fertilizers using compost and using cover crops together with the commercial fertilizers. This is to help rebuild the soil.

The Control of insects were mentioned in order that when the early vegetables which are already planted are attacked they may have on hand some of the insecticides such as chlodane, sabadilla, and cryolite dusts.

CLOTHING AND TEXTILES Title Negro Co. Home Dem. Agent County Waller Dist. Eastern

Method Demonstrations were given this month on "Using a commercial Pattern and the equipment to help sewing easy" to the home demonstration clubs. A printed pattern and unprinted pattern was shown explaining how to read and interpret the unprinted pattern by the perforations and the printed pattern by the printings. How to cut away the pattern beyond the margin line which is the outline of the pattern before ~~laying~~ the pattern. Measurements were taken and alterations were made on the patterns to show how to alter according to the body size difference from the standard pattern size. The instruction sheets were explained and emphasized in order that they read and follow the pattern's guide sheet.

The equipment was displayed abd some used to show how they are to be used. They were the tracing wheel, dressmaker's carbon, cutting shears, pinking shears, ruler, yard stick and hem marker and Brass pins. These tools makes cutting out easy.

During the State Extension Agents conference at Prairie View, Texas February 12-14, the group course in foods and nutrition where Miss L. Mason and Miss J. N. Harris, Foods and Nutrition Specialists of College Station, Texas gave demonstrations that were very helpful to the agents. We received the improved techniques and methods of getting the food value over to the farm families that they may improve the health of their families through the planning and preparation of meals, emphasizing the Texas Food Standard.

A vegetable platter was prepared by Miss Mason assisted by Miss Harris and Peanut Butter Bread was prepared by Miss Harris assisted by Miss Mason.

These refresher courses are very helpful to the home agents and the Agricultural agents especially those in counties alone will be helped if they can attend these Foods and Nutrition courses. The Nutrition information is what they can help the farm families in their counties with.

The 4-H poultry demonstrators are making plans this month to buy baby chicks and to continue their poultry demonstrations. Some new poultry demonstrators are added to carry on demonstrations. The provision of suitable brooding facilities are being made this month so that the chicks can be bought in March.

The adult poultry demonstrations are buying their chicks. Mrs. Jones of Hempstead community purchased 475 chicks and doing nicely with them. She bought 275 in January and 200 this month these are being raised for egg production. They are the Hybrid type called Truline.

Killing and Dressing Poultry for Market and Home Use

This demonstration were given by Mr. J. J. Woods, Poultry Instructor of Prairie View A & M College to a group during the state meeting for Extension agents. Each person who wanted to, killed, and dressed a fryer. The experience was good for every body and using the equipment was something else good- the electric picker, the racks, special table for drawing and cooling room. The special knives made the job easy. The techniques Mr. Woods showed us was very helpful.

At this meeting they were given demonstration on putting the waist on the skirt, sleeves in and the zipper placket. Seven of these garments will be completed by the next meeting and will be worn to club meeting for judging.

The other clubs in the county were given method demonstrations on "Making Bound Buttonholes" to give our dresses that dress up look.

Keeping time with the world seems to be what the women of the county want to do- many requests came in for information on how to prepare food for the home freezer. Some families have planned to purchase a home freezer this summer after the harvest of watermelons, cantulopes, cucumbers and other truck crops,

A training meeting for leaders were given on April 2, at the Sam Scharz School Home Economics Department on preparing foods for the home freezer using vegetables, fruits and meats. (Snap beans, apples and pork chops) were used in the demonstration. Miss Naoma Cox, Foods and Nutrition Specialist, College Station, visited the county on that day and worked with the agent on planning the food phase according to the county's plan of work and also assisted with the training meeting held on frozen foods.

The gardens got a real good soaking this month. The garden demonstrators were visited and were shown how to apply insecticides for controlling insects. A black hairy worm was seen around this area and were very thick and chlordane dust has been used in the gardens and it seems that these worms are thinning out. Don't know whether they have a certain time to come and go or the dust helped. This dust is used for other insects also and seems to be helpful. Grasshoppers haven't started yet but the gardeners are preparing for all insects.

Since the gardeners are using seed treatments there are not much plant diseases as have been before. The families have been eating beets, carrots, onions and radishes out of the gardens.

The last rain will push other vegetables on and a solution of commercial fertilizer was recommended to feed the plants for better production.

In spite of the weather and late planting and replanting there are some very pretty gardens in the county.

The truck gardens consists of cucumbers and snap beans and they are growing nicely. The farmers contract to grow cucumbers for a Produce Company in Houston, Texas and about 35 acres have been planted.

Turkey production is expanding with chicken decreasing. The efforts put forth in securing and raising turkeys each year is evident in the number of turkeys each family is trying to produce.

Mr. Charlie Williams of Monaville community is having good success in growing 400 turkeys while Mr. Eristus Sam of Prairie View community is doing well with 1100 turkeys.

Approximately 7,000 turkeys are being grown among farmers who are raising from 50 to 100 turkeys each.

Farmers are learning to prevent diseases and other handicaps that will prevent good success in turkey raising through demonstrations given by the county agents.

Among some of the main factors discussed are sanitation and feeding.

When hot weather arrives the thought of cooking the family's meals over a hot stove is drudgery, yet it must go on. The rural families in this county haven't done much outdoor eating nor outdoor cooking and in planning for the method demonstration on vegetable cookery it was thought that the women would like this vegetable cookery in connection with some outdoor eating. The women were given suggestions on a few tricks to do with preparing and serving summer meals on these extra hot days. This county having watermelons, cantaloupes and tomatoes in abundance, suggested menus were made up using these foods in the diet.

Method demonstration were given on cooking potatoes in the jacket wrapped in brown paper and baked in the oven. Cabbage was cooked over a slow fire with little water for a short period of time to retain the flavor, vitamins and minerals. Cabbage and potatoes were found in every farm garden this month and they were used in the demonstration.

Eating out of doors at home offers better family spirit, relaxation and recreation and it also gives a chance to realize the beauty and miracles of nature.

Twelve home demonstration agents attended a clothing school at Prairie View A. and M. College July 21-26 under the supervision of Miss Mary Routh, Extension Clothing Specialist. Special and better techniques in sewing construction and short cuts were demonstrated as the agents made better dresses.

The purpose of the clothing school was to help these agents who are carrying on clothing demonstrations in their counties to make improvement and solve the sewing problems and to make better dresses.

The agents selected to attend this school were four from each of the three districts.

The fabrics brought by the agents to make dresses were: linens, pure silks, all wool crepe, and rayon acetate failles. Patterns were also bought and styles were selected according to the fabric brought. Each agent had several patterns to choose from.

At the close of the week the dresses were almost finished but they were modeled and judged.

Planning for increased poultry production was done with poultry demonstrators this month. Mrs. Irene Bragg of Harper Community had a deep well dug for supplying plenty water for poultry and farm use. Mrs Bragg has been hauling water from the old home place not far from her present new place and in planning for her poultry demonstration the well was one of the necessary equipments for the farm. Mrs. Braggs has a laying house and 75 replacement layers will go into production soon.

Mrs. L. V. Jones of Hempstead community has 200 replacement layers just started laying.

Turkey production is still on the increase in the county. More of the turkey growers are beginning to raise them more in confinement rather than the range way. The growers have also realized that water is a very important factor on the farm especially in growing turkeys and chickens and more well are being improved and in a lot of instances an electric pumps are being installed. Now they can pay a small payment down and small monthly payment on electric water systems.

Since the expanding turkey production program in the county, Mrs. Rebecca Williams of Larry community is carrying on a successful business of raising turkeys which she expects to sell retail before Christmas to her regular customers on the water front in Houston, Texas. She bought 400 - 4 weeks old poults in April and now have 365 of them growing well. Mrs. Williams has been raising and selling about 75 to 100 turkeys each year but did not have enough to supply the needs of the people so she increased her number of turkeys this year.

Mr. E. Sams has 900 turkeys growing nicely out of which he started with 1100. Mr. Sams and Mrs. Williams lost some of the poults when they first got them. Since the birds were gotten at 4 weeks old the change in feed and temperature might had an effect on them getting adjusted therefore some died.

Other turkey growers in the county with 50 to 150 birds reports that they are growing off well. Emphasis are given to the growers on good feeding practices.

Plans were made with poultry demonstrators to increase egg production. Mrs. L. V. Jones of Hempstead community, Mrs. Ella Mae Davis of Wyatt Chapel community and Mrs. Beatrice Jordan of Sunnyside community were visited this month to make plans for increasing their flocks.
