Plan of Work for Negro Women and Girls

Home Demonstration Work Waller County 1945

The original 25 communities of Waller County where Negroes live was divided into sections called communities and neighborhoods. In 1942 the County was divided into 5 communities and 25 Negro neighborhoods by the County Agents.

This made the contacts with Home Demonstration work closer to the remote areas of the county and making the rural people more conscious of defense activities such as food production, perservation storage and preparation, nutrition, scrap drives, war bonds and war chest and stamp rallies. Nutrition courses were given by certified nutrition Instructors.

Waller County is situated in the South east protion of Texas, bordered by Grimes, Washington, Austin, Fort Bent, Harris and Montgomery counties. The Brazos River forms the Western boundary. In the uplands are found heavy clay soil and sandy loams; rich alluvial soil in the bottom; and quite waxy in the center of the county. The timber production includes post oak, pine, cottonwood, live oak sycamore, ash and elm. The minerals includes oil, gas, sand, and gravel and brick clay. The principal crops are cotton, peanuts, rice, irish and sweet potatoes, watermelons and hay. Rice and feed crops are expanding with a reduction in Cotton. Truck watermelons are commercial crops. Beef cattle, hogs, sheep and goats are raised for market. Dairying is limited to county needs. The Poultry industry is expanding greatly. There are over 175 farms owned by Wegroes and statistics show 558 Negro farmers operating farms. Hempstead is the County seat, and is well situated for shipping and exchange of retail markets; it has diversified income from agriculture; a box factory and other industries. Other towns are Brookshire, Waller, and Prairie View, the latter is the site of Prairie View State Mormal and Industrial College.

The Extension Service has made possible home demonstration work in the County which has done much to stimulate the interest of women along improved methods of farming and living in the rural. This work is shown through out the county in new homes - repair of old homes and out buildings as well as an increase in food production.

The major demonstrations to be conducted during 1945 are Gardening, Home improvement and Clothing, as they have a direct influence on helping to win the war including Production, Storage and food preparation. The woman are doing their share to help win the war, they have pledged themselves as Victory Demonstrators.

There are 5 communities 23 neighborhoods 558 farm families and 176 farms owned. It Neighborhoods have organized home demonstration clubs, 300 women members. The 4H girls' Club are organized in seven of the 14 neighborhoods with 120 families. Il Neighborhoods in the county have no clubs organized and plans have been made to work wit these unorganized clubs for 1945. There are 65 Victory Demonstrators in the neighborhoods with Home Demonstration Clubs and 25 Victory demonstrators in neighborhoods with 4H Clubs.
