Analysis of County Situation

Waller County is situated in the southeast portion of Texas, bordered by Grimes, Washington, Austin, Fort Bend, Harris and Montgomery counties. The Brazos River forms the boundary west of the county. Sandy loams, heavy clay soils are predominate on uplands, rich alluvial in bottoms, some waxy in center county. Timber includes post oak, pine, cottonwood, live oak, sycamore, ash and elm. Mineral include oil, gas, sand, gravel and brick clay. The principle crops are cotton, peanuts, grain sorghum, corn, rice, Irish potatoes, sweet potatoes and hay. Truck watermelons are commercial crops. Food and rice crops expanding with cotton reduction. Beef cattle, hogs, sheep are raised for market. Dairying is limited to county needs. Poultry industry is expanding. There are approximately one hundred eighty (180) farms owned by Negroes and statistics shows 470 Negro farmers operating farms.

Hempstead is the county seat and situated for shipping and exchange of retail markets; has diversified income from agriculture products. Other towns are Waller, Brookshire, Pattison and Prairie View, the latter is site of Prairie View A. & M. College (Negro Senior College). The county has rural free mail delivery that fairly covers the whole county. There are 25 communities in the county where Negroes live. In these communities are one or more churches and eight schools.

The trend of employment is still increasing in activities. Construction jobs on roads and buildings and jobs in oil fields makes this possible. Prairie View A. & M. College makes employment for approximately 125 families. The expanding rice and peanut production makes employment for a large number of Negro laborers.

Extension work in the county has been carried on more than a quarter of a century having eight (8) home demonstration agents working with Negro farm families during this period. The change in practices of home making has definitely resulted from home demonstration work in three hundred (300) homes.

The rural families are reached by the home demonstration agent through club meetings, home visits, conducting method demonstrations, and conducting informational demonstrations and training meetings to help improve living conditions. Circular and individual letters are sent to rural families on current events, bulletins and

phamplets are given as an additional aid.

The living standards of Negroes in the county have increased to a large extent with the improvement of homes, purchasing of new furnishings, labor saving devices, the installation of telephones, electricity, electric water pumps, windmills, Butane gas system and septic tanks.

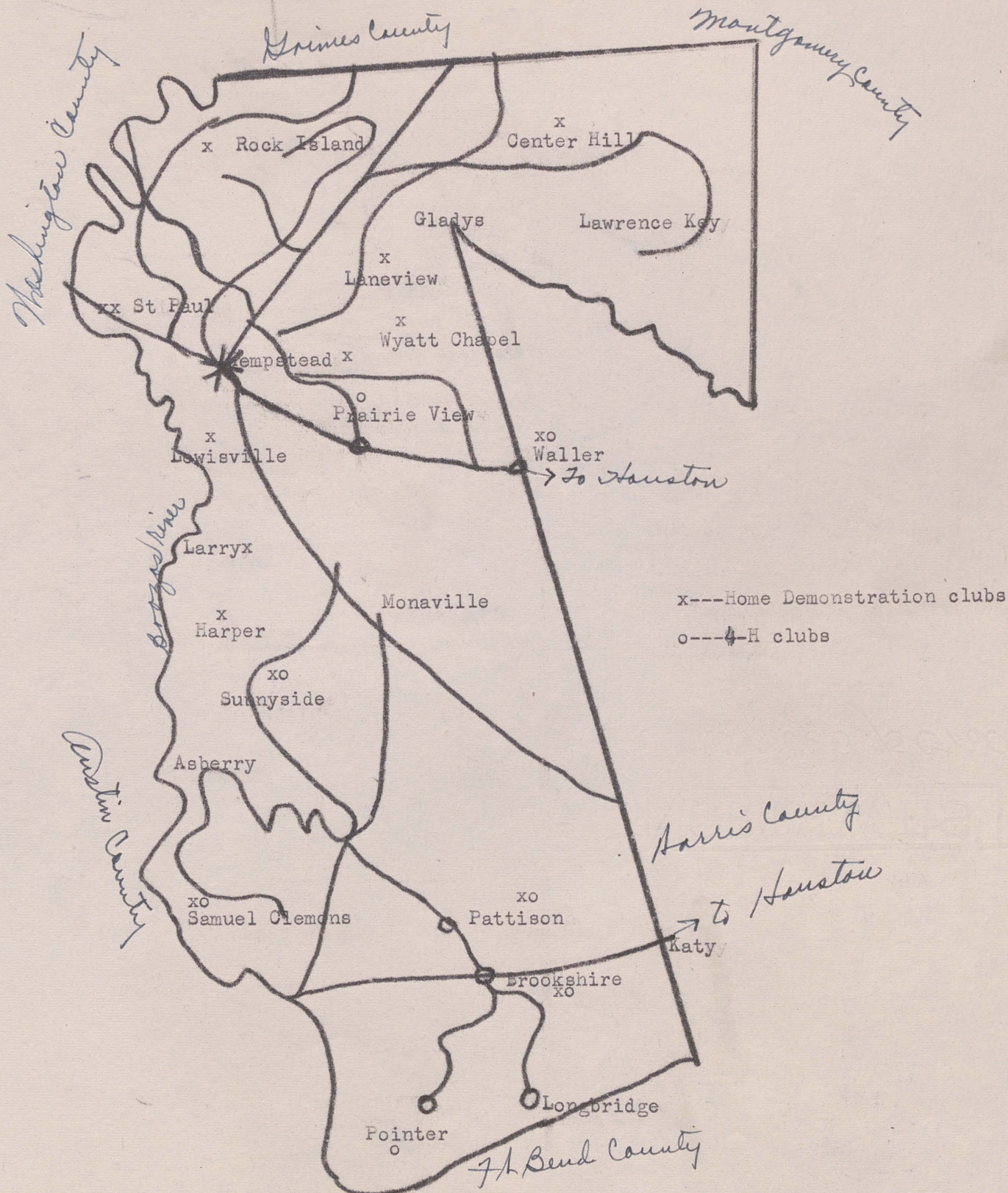
As a result of the influence of home demonstration work conducted in 1949 and in previous years an attempt has been made to help rural families have financial security, emotional security, good health, and self-expression.

The needs of the rural families in the county have been analyzed and the plan of work for 1950 have been worked out to help these families meet their needs. The major demonstrations for 1950 are Clothing and Garden Production.

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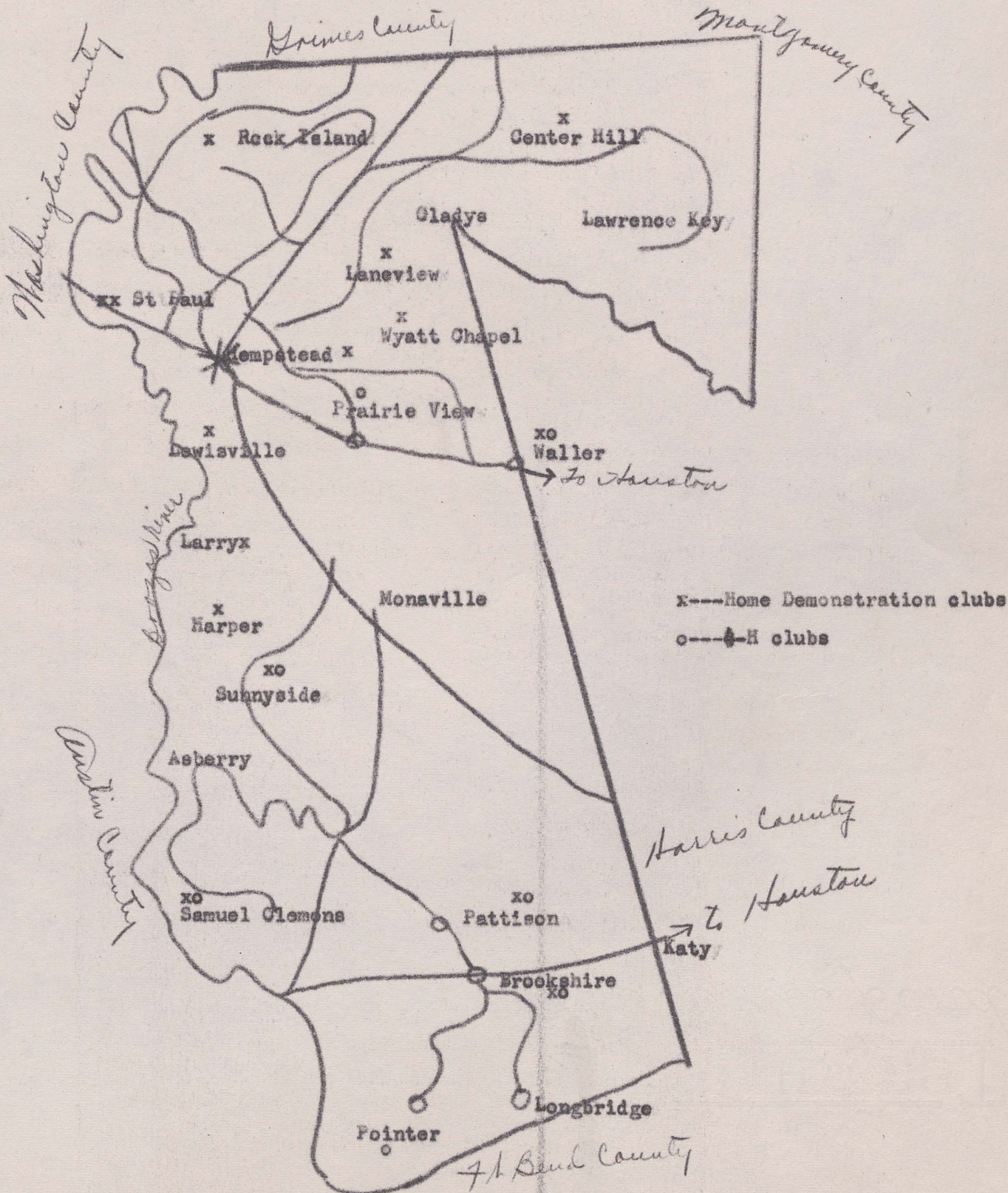
