Seven clubs were given demonstrations on, The Care of Walls and Floors, with an attendance of 72.

The purpose of these demonstrations were to: (1) help families have floors that are safe as well as attractive and to learn how to properly care for them. (2) help families to learn the techniques and tools for cleaning walls and floors.

It was pointed out that statistics showed that there were 28,000 deaths from home accidents in 1956, all ages. Almost half of these persons-13,000 died because they fell and about 1/5 of the falls inside the home occurred in bedrooms.

Several reasons were given why such accidents occur, naming the condition of the floor as one of the contributing cause of some of them. Many reasons were given how these accidents could be avoided.

The agent discussed how to maintain a safe floor, how to use wax, kinds of floor coverings and the care it should be given. The desirable equipment to use for floors and walls were shown. How to care for papered and painted walls, how to remove spots, how to care for vinyl wall coverings and plywood walls were pointed out.

Many of the members were in the midst of their spring cleaning and said the information they received was quiet helpful.

4. To plan a menu using the product and show how it can be used or served.

There are only a few families who ever think of serving any other bread besides biscuits, pancakes and toast for breakfast. These demonstrations help to show that there are other breads that can be used in the daily diet which are just as good and nutritious.

One 4-H girl reported that when she made her first muffins she had some disappointments from the smaller members of the family as they were expecting them to be sweet as they had never eaten bread muffins before. The demonstrations on breads were continued this year in the plan of work as a bread show has been planned for May, and the 4-H girls will participate by giving bread demonstrations.
