

San Jacinto County is located in East Central Texas. A large part of it being in the famous Trinity and San Jacinto river valley the most productive land in Texas.

The large part of it has been held in large bodies by lumber companies. and has not been on the market at any price, nor opened up for development until now.

The county is in the Texas Costal Oil district, and oil prospecting, leasing and drilling has commenced here and prospects of developing looks good. We are well served by highways and graded roads, Cold Spring the county seat is located on Highway No. 45 about 60 miles from Houston, and about 75 miles inland from the Gulf and about the same from the Louisiana State line.

The land lie mostly sloping to gently rolling, well drained by many creeks flowing into the Trinity and San Jacinto rivers; which have high banks and rapid currents.

Population 9056 of this number 4740 are negroes who farm chiefly for a living, we have many different types of soil, each especially adapted to some particular crop or crops. At the Trinity and San Jacinto rivers, and running back from one to five miles, we have heavy black soil as the higher elevations are reached, very little land in the county needs fertilizing.

A crop failure is unknown with our ten months growing season, plenty of rain and sunshine, Land may be planted again and again, so that a complete failure of crops is practically unknown.

The principal crops are Cotton, corn, oats, rye, peanuts, sweet potatoes, ribbon and sugar cane, sorghum cane, alfalfa, sudan grass, stock peas, watermelons, cantaloupes and many other field crops, and many combinations where two crops or more are grown on the same ground in the same year. and vegetables such as tomatoes, radishes, cabbage, onions, lettuce, carrots, beets, turnips, beans, peas, collards, cucumbers, squash, and okra in fact we do not know of any vegetable that will not grow and do well here, and when you harvest you plant again tomatoes will bear on the same stalk from May until frost in November.

Peaches, pears, grapes, (all kind and varieties), figs, apricots, plums, apples, persimmons, mulberries, dewberries, blackberries, strawberries, etc; do well. This is a great fruit country, and you have almost an endless variety to select from.

The same is true of roses and other flowers and shrubbery of all kind. Cotton is planted and cultivated about the same as corn and is usually picked twice,

Our long season and ten months pasture(85 per cent of which is open free range) with plenty of pure spring and creek water, makes the county especially adapted to stock raising.

The county has an elevation of from 250 to 300 feet above the Sea level, Health conditions here are excellent, the gulf breeze coming to us over the pine tops, located on high elevation, good drainage, free stone draining water year round, vegetables from the garden, and great variety of fruit, health is bound to be good, the low death rate proves it.

Deer, squirrel, wild turkeys and small game in season, Our creeks, rivers and natural lakes brimming full of black bass and trout. San Jacinto county the Garden of Eden, in its days as it were, when people lived 100 years and died happy.
