Analysis of County Situation

San Jacinto County is located in East Central Texas, the county is well served by highways and graded roads.


Coldspring the county seat is located on Highway 50 about 60 miles North of Houston, and about 75 miles inland from the Louisana State line.

Population 919 of this number 519 are Negroes who farm cheafly for a living, The principal crops are cotton, corn, oats, peanuts, sweet potatoes, irish potatoes, ribon came, stock peas, watermelons, cantalopes and many other crops.

Vegetables such as tomatoes, reddishes, cabbage, onions, lettuce, carrots, beets, turnips, okra, beans, english peas, collards, cucumbers, squash, mustard, spinach, kale, swischard, eggplants, butter beans and pepper, these vegetables are grown for home comsumption.

The twenty one rural school that was scattered over the county has been sonsolidated into seven schools, the five Farm to Market roads that has been built in the pass three years makes It possable for school busses to carry children from all communities in the county to consolidated county schools.

One other county project that has brought about a friendly relation between all of the people in the county was the purchasing and improving the San Jacinto Fair Ground, the six acre plot was cleared, one exhibit building and stock pens was all ready for the county fair to open October 25, 1951, just another step forward for San Jacinto County.
