San Jacinto county is located in East Central Texas, population 919 of this number 519 are negroes who farm chiefly for a living, the soil varies from a rich black land to sandy loam.

The county is well timbered with a rolling surface which frequent floods after hard rains.

The principal crops are cotton, corn, potatoes and peas, vegetables are grown mosely for home consumption,.

The county is organized into groups or clubs that take in the entire 22 communities and neighborhoods where negroes live, there are twelve organizations for women and eleven for girls, the girls clubs has a membership of 200 girls, the women's clubs has a membership of 189 women, each club has it's local leaders.

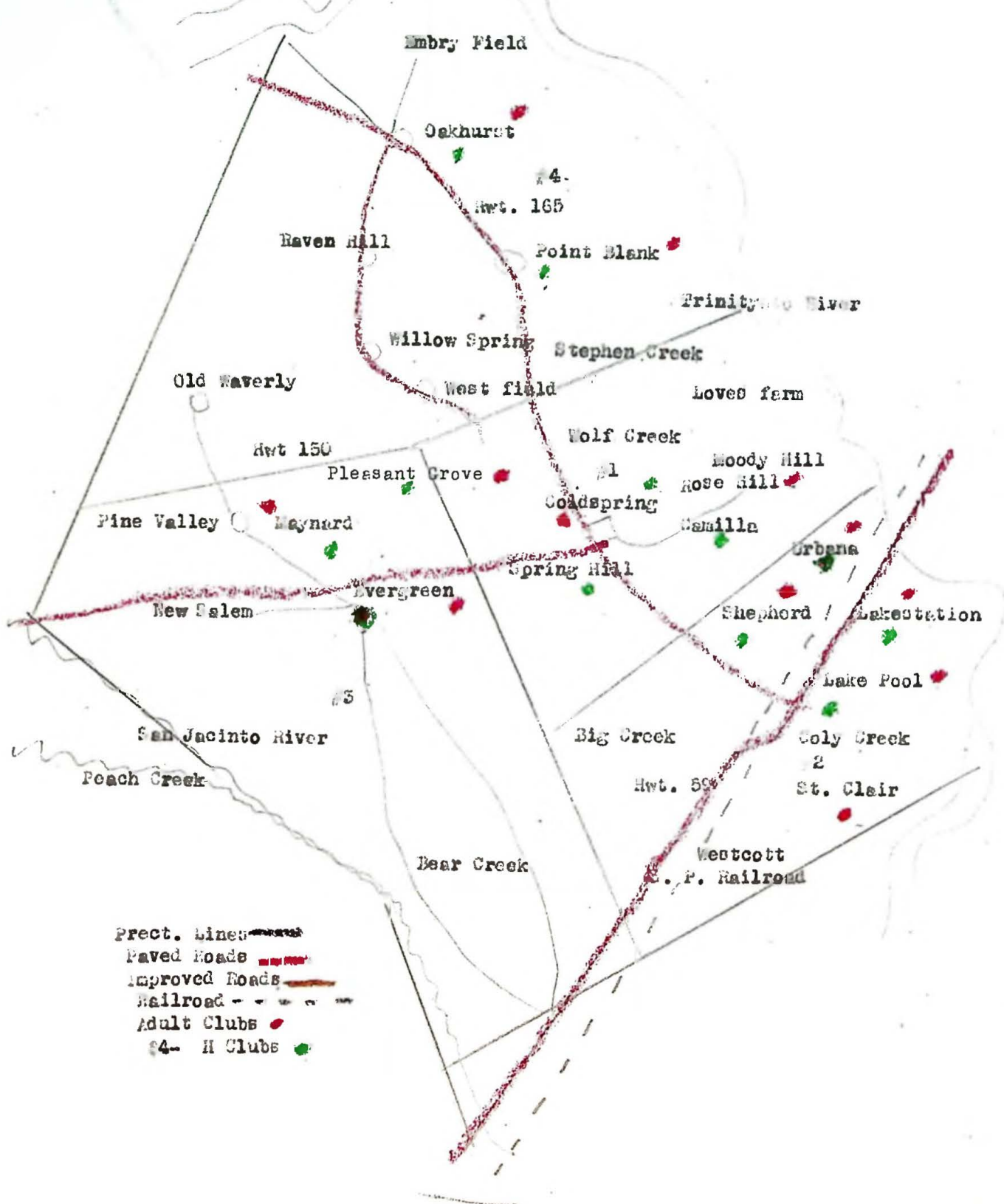
The County Home Demonstration Council: A demonstration in organization is made up of local club leaders that meet once each month, it is through this organization home demonstration work has been carried to every community in the county.

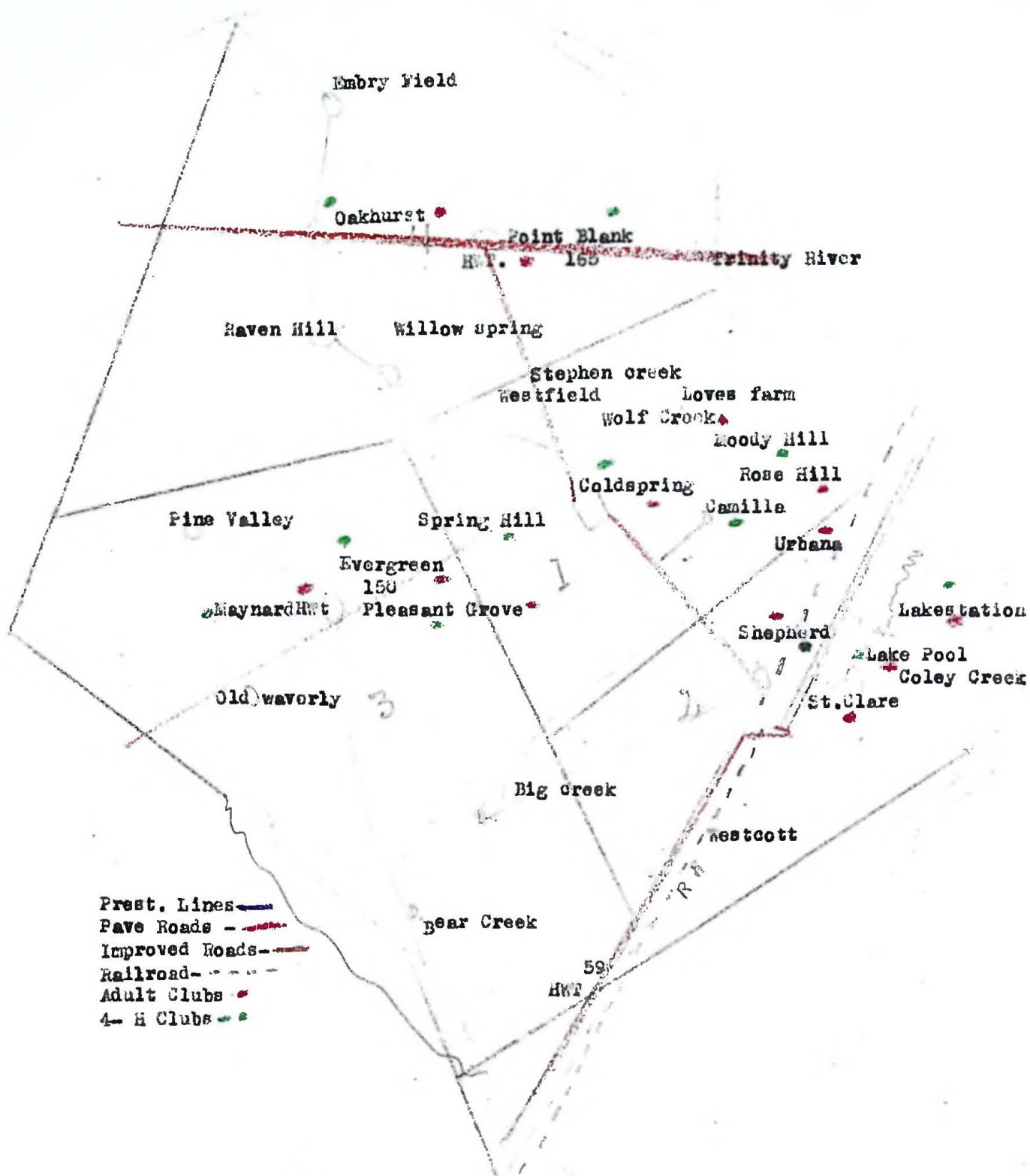
