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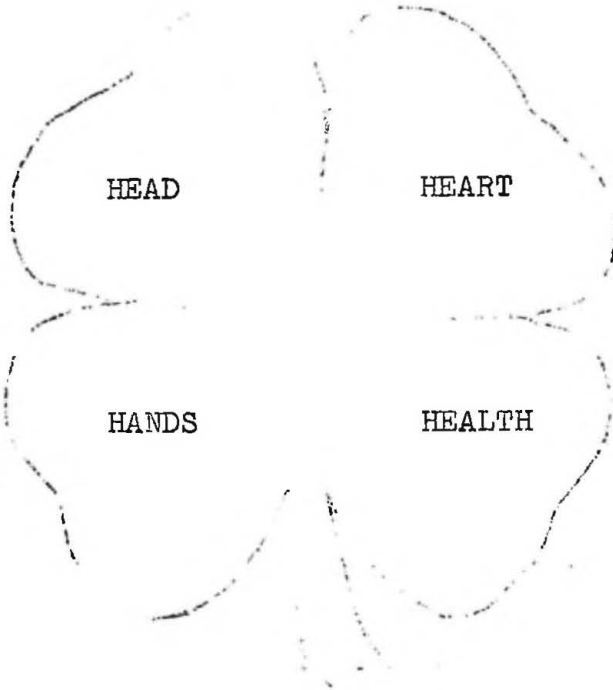

1. Call to Order: President: "The Meeting will now come to order. Will the song leader please lead us in our opening exercises?"
2. Song & Prayer: Song Leader: "Will the members stand and sing Jacob's Ladder & recite the 4-H prayer?"
3. Pledge to the Flag: President: "Let's remain standing & give the Pledge to the American Flag."
4. Roll Call: President: "The secretary will please call the roll. Will each of you answer by naming a vegetable."
5. Reading of Minutes: President: "We will now hear the reading of the minutes by the Secretary."
6. Approval of Minutes: President: "You have heard the reading of the minutes. Are there any corrections? (pause) If not the minutes stand approved as read, (If correction) "The minutes stand approved as corrected."
7. Business: President: "We will now have the committee reports. Is there any old or unfinished business to come before the club? Is there any new

business to come
before the club?"

8. Demonstration: President: "The 4-H club leader (or agent) is now in charge (See calendar of events for topics of monthly demonstrations.)"

9. Recreational Period: President: "The recreation Leader is in charge of this period."

10. Announcements: President: "Do we have any announcements?"

11. Adjourn: Member: "I move that we adjourn".
 Member: "I second the motion."
 President: "It has been moved & seconded to adjourn. All in favor say "aye". All opposed say "no". The ayes have it, the motion is carried & the meeting is adjourned."

DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

Duties of the President:

1. Sees that there is a meeting place that is in order.
2. Reminds members of the time and place of meetings.
3. Plans the club meeting.
4. Asks each person who is to be on program to take his part and to be prepared.
5. Begins meeting on time.
6. Conducts meeting in an orderly manner.
7. Appoints committees.
8. Conducts elections.
9. Adjourns on time.

The Vice-President:

1. Takes the place of the president when she is absent or when the president asks her to do so.
2. Becomes president if the president resigns.
3. Helps the president.

The Secretary-Treasurer:

1. Keeps the record book which contains:
 - a. The roll and attendance record.
 - b. The minutes.
 - c. A record of the Club's money.
2. Calls the roll and checks the attendance.
3. Reads the minutes of the last meeting.
4. Takes notes for writing minutes of the meeting being held.
5. Reads letters or information to the Club.
6. Reports money received and spent and the balance in the treasury.

7. Write letters for the Club.
8. Arrange for money to be kept safely.
9. Pays bills as voted by the Club.
10. Keeps a record of the Club's money.
