More and more boys and girls are finding and will find training for the adult world in learning by doing.

The activities are family ones, yet through 4-H Club activities each child can have one animal or one project of his or her own to manage, to develop or raise and finance, through this they can learn to have a little business of their own.

It is true that some farm families work together always, first it was an economic necessity but later they have fostered the idea as a good way to create a better relation through family life.

Families can do much to help them selves, but there are many things in the county which disturb good family growth. The family is often confused by too much information and help, the News paper, Magazines, Radio, Movies and people in many groups and organizations all are wanting to tell the farm family what to do and how to do it, but farm families are learning to work carefully in choosing these helps.

The family is the anvil on which are being hammered out all the conflicts and confusions to day. The family as well as the individuals suffer from lack of money, lack of space, and lack of the needed facilities to do a good farm job. I find that too much is expected of farm people with too little to do with.

New interest in home management has been shown with 222 rural families in developing time, money, and skill in making their homes and surroundings more comfortable, more convenient, and attractive.

The farmer and his family have always practiced thrift, but information and help given through Extension Service Program are resulting in more systematic and business like management, of time, labor, resources, income and expenditure on farms and in farm homes.

Twenty two local leaders was trained to help do simple repairs such as window lights, steps, screens, doors and water pipes. Kitchens improved 132, bedroom improved 122, Bath rooms built with plumbing and permanent equipment 6. Pieces of furniture refinished 142, chairs reupholstered 14, Refrigerators added 30. Another factor which enters into good home management is the cooperation of all members of the family working to carry out the schedule of house hold-work.

Poultry Production work begin with enrolling demonstrators, plans for the year 1950: Repair fences, build poultry houses, build homemade lamp brooder where needed, white wash old houses and nest, select eggs to set, look after the water supply and care of baby chicks.

Demonstrations was given in the following: to help demonstrators accomplish their goals care of poultry house, culling the flock, feeding for egg production, care of baby chicks,

As a result of work with poultry the following has been accomplished: Old houses remodded 20, brood coops built 16, poultry meetings conducted 3, Money realize from sales of poultry \$ 176.25, Money realized from sales of eggs \$ 159.00 and twenty nine families are doing a better job of live stock production.
