"Insect Control" Title: Negro CAA County: Nacogdoches Dist. W

Since the ravages of insects to the spring and fall gardens have been more than usual this past year, a number of days were spent this month on control measures of insects in the home garden. Bulletins on the control of some of these were distributed at each meeting. Some of the points stressed in an insect control program were: to eradicate old refuse piles close to the garden plot so that insects would have no place to live over winter; and to start control measures in time to save plants from too much damage and thereby save on material used in combating these.

The different types of insecticides and their proper usage were discussed. Control measures of other insects were discussed in these meeting. It is felt that with a more thorough knowledge of insect life cycles an effective insect control program can be initiated.

A total of eight farmers of the Sacul Community made a trip to the home of Mr. Sam Davis, Jr., October 3, to view his 3,000 capacity brooder house. These men were interested in going into the poultry business, and since Mr. Davis is one of the outstanding farmers in the County, a visit to his farm was recommended so that the group could get a factual picture of the poultry raising practices he uses.

The NCAA, along with the assistant of Mr. Davis and the Vocational Agriculture instructor, gave instructions on proper management in the operation of a brooder unit, the mixing of home grown feeds, and sanitation. At the time of the visit, a new batch of chicks had just arrived, and the group had a chance to witness some of the sanitation practices with respect to clean litters and other measures. Mr. Davis explained to the group his venture in the poultry business and the margin of profit to be made along with his other farming enterprises.

The greater portion of the month of September was spent in making a county survey of all the communities in the county. The county agent found it expedient to do this in the light of the fact that I have just returned to the county and am not familiar with some of the problems that exist. These home visits were made with the idea of getting acquainted with some of these problems.

Along with this, survey sheets were made to gather some factual information regarding these. The latter part of the month, after having visited these communities, two council meetings were held with members of the county council and others members of the different communities to outline the program in the county for the following year. These consisted of improving the soil, the planting of more different crops for a diversified farming program, the production of beef cattle, along with pasture improvement programs, and a poultry program for the county.

It is believed that meetings of this type will better enable the county agent to do a better job of supervising in the county by understanding the problems at hand.

The time devoted to the production of broilers for the market this month was for the benefit of those group of individuals who are interested in this type of project, and requested such information.

In this aspect we discussed the equipment needed for a project of this size, the care of the young chicks and the proper feed mixtures for the most growth in the shortest possible time. Also discussed was the important part of having a small amount of chicks to perish for the want of proper temperature conditions; the brooder house and the care of this, especially sanitation measures, and the growing of green feeds on the open range in the summer months as some of them plan on doing.

It was found that the greatest mortality rate in the county with broilers raised for the market was the disease hazards, these and other aspects were dwelled on to great extent, and also the price of feed and the margin of profit one can expect to make in a venture of this type.

One day this past month was specifically set aside for a demonstration on improving the soil through the planting of soil improving crops, although other days in the making of the community survey were also devoted to this aspect. These being mostly impromptu lectures dealt with the beneficial aspects of planting these soil improving crops such as, conserving the soluble nutrients already in the soil, the addition of nitrogen to the soil in the case of the legumes, the transferring of nutrients from the sub-soil to the upper most layers of the soil, to affect the growth of beneficial organisms in the soil, to increase the carbon-dioxide content of the soil air, and as an aid in controlling the erosion of the soil.

In the selection of the soil improving crops to plant the following points were brought into consideration: the adaptation of the crop to this particular soil and climate, the quantity and quality of vegetable matter produced and the time it takes to produce it, the character of the root growth, and the time the crop is to be planted. Bur clover was recommended for this section for those growing winter gardens since it is mainly a winter crop.

In discussing the results of the soybean, which have given poor results in this section, it was recommended that a better soil improving crop could be had from the planting of the cowpea since the soybean thrives better on a heavier soil and in a cooler climate than the cowpea, and also on poor soils it does not produce so much crop as the cowpea and the stems are coarser.

Other soil improving crops were discussed, and their merits as to this section, this along with the recommended rate of planting and fertilizers that give best results.

During the month of July one field demonstration on "Cotton Insect Control" was held. This demonstration was held on several farms to check the results of poisoned cotton.

Mr. L. F. Greer of the Bureau of Entomology and Plant Quarantine, Waco, Texas, was with us to conduct the demonstration and answer questions regarding insect control.

On this demonstration Mr. Greer showed each farmer how to make insect counts in his field to determine when to poison. Of the fields checked the count ran from 10 to 48%.

Of the fields checked, Bunch Fowler had the lowest count with 10%. Each farmer had the pleasure of seeing the results of cotton that had been Pre-Square Poisoned.

The poisoning of cotton for insects such as boll weevils, thrips and leaf hoppers is still of great importance. Though most of the crops have been poisoned once, there is still a large demand for it in the county.

During the latter part of the month a group of farmers visited a farm, the first to be poisoned in the county to check on the results of the poison, at the present time this farm has some of the best cotton in the county. All the other crops treated are responding just as well.

On a return visit to this farm only a few thrips, leaf hoppers and boll weevils were found. All the farms in the county are infested with cotton insects but at the rate we are poisoning I feel that the damage to crops will be light.
