Representatives from five communities in Nacogdoches County met in the Agricultural assemble room Oct. 13, 1961 at 7:30 P.M. to discuss county problems and what can be done about them.

The purpose of county program building as it was explained inn the meeting is a means of bringing together representative groups and individuals to determine county problems. It serves as a channel for bringing problems from the people to the attention of the agencies concerned and for taking needed information to the people. In so doing the committee helps make full use of all available resources, both public and private, in solving problems.

In this meeting Eddie Orum Negro Co. Agri. Agent discussed the county situation as it relates to farm income. The figures shows that crop production has decreased where as livestock production has increased, on the other hand, the census shows that farmers in the county are spending \$4 Million a year for feed which is being purchased out of the county. The county average yield of corn per acre is 29bu. Every effort should be made to increase the county average to reduce the amount of feed purchased out of the county.

A more detail study is being made of our county situation to determine where we stand as it relates to agricultural production.

Five adult leaders in the Sand hill community met the Agent at the Sandhill community cementery to set up plans for a spraying demonstration to control weeds and brush on the ground. A thorough inspection was made by the group. The purpose of the visit was to check the acreage and the type of brush to be sprayed. The cementery is composed of two acres. Weed found on the ground was: Grass burs, bull nettles and water grass. Brush included oaks, elms and switch cane.

It was estimated by the group from previous working of the cementery, that it would take 10 days to clean the ground with a hoe and ax, at the rate of \$6.00 per day, would be a total of \$60.00.

To use chemicals we estimated that one gallon of Esteron 99 and 100 gallons of water and 2 cups of 2,4,5-T. Esteron 99 4lb. acid equivalent would cost \$5.50 per gallon. Two cups of 2,4,5-T about 50 Cents and 5 gallons of fuel oil 14 cents per gallon 70 Cents. The total cost to use chemicals is estimated at \$6.70. Four men believe they could spray the 2 acres in 2hrs.

Part of this 2,4,5-T was sprayed on switch cane Sept 19th. the balance of the 2,4,5-T will be sprayed on bull nettles, elms, Oaks, October 20r 3rd by the group

Mr. Gene Garrett is in charge of this demonstration in his community.

A preservative treatment of pine fence post with pentachlorophenal by the cold-soaking method was set up as a demonstration August 14, 1961 on G. W. Berkely's farm on woden road. Berkely cut and peel 117 post in early June of this year, by August 14th they were dry enough to treat. His cost of cuting and peeling was \$5.85 or 5¢ per post. The post was cut seven feet in length.

Circular No 34 on preservative treatment of pine fence post was used in determining the number of gallons of solution to use. It added up to 464 gal. The East, Texas post treating plant located in Nacogdoches sells the solution for 30Cents per Gal. When you purchase a 50 gal. drum (\$15.00). Buying the solution and mixing your self 50 gals. would cost \$18.00.

This demonstration was completed and checked Sept. 28th. Number of gallons used were 41½ at 30 Cents per Gallon = \$12.45 plus \$5.85 = \$18.30 Total cost of treating 94 post. The cost to purchase the same number of post treated in this demonstration \$60.70. Berkely saved \$42.40. These post will be used to repair fence around his farm.

Three days of this month was devoted to County Program Building. Mr. R. A. Sanders District Agent (N) and Mr. D. H. Seastrunk, Specialist in Farm and Home Development from the Prairie View Office visited in the County Sept. 5-6, in which a conference was held in the Agent Office on County Program building and Farm and Home Development.

During the conference we went over in detail the complete set up and duties of a county program building committee. In farm and Home Development we discussed record keeping and workshops for Farm and Home Development families. Files in the office was also checked.

During the supervisors visited in the County we visited a post treating demonstration in progress.

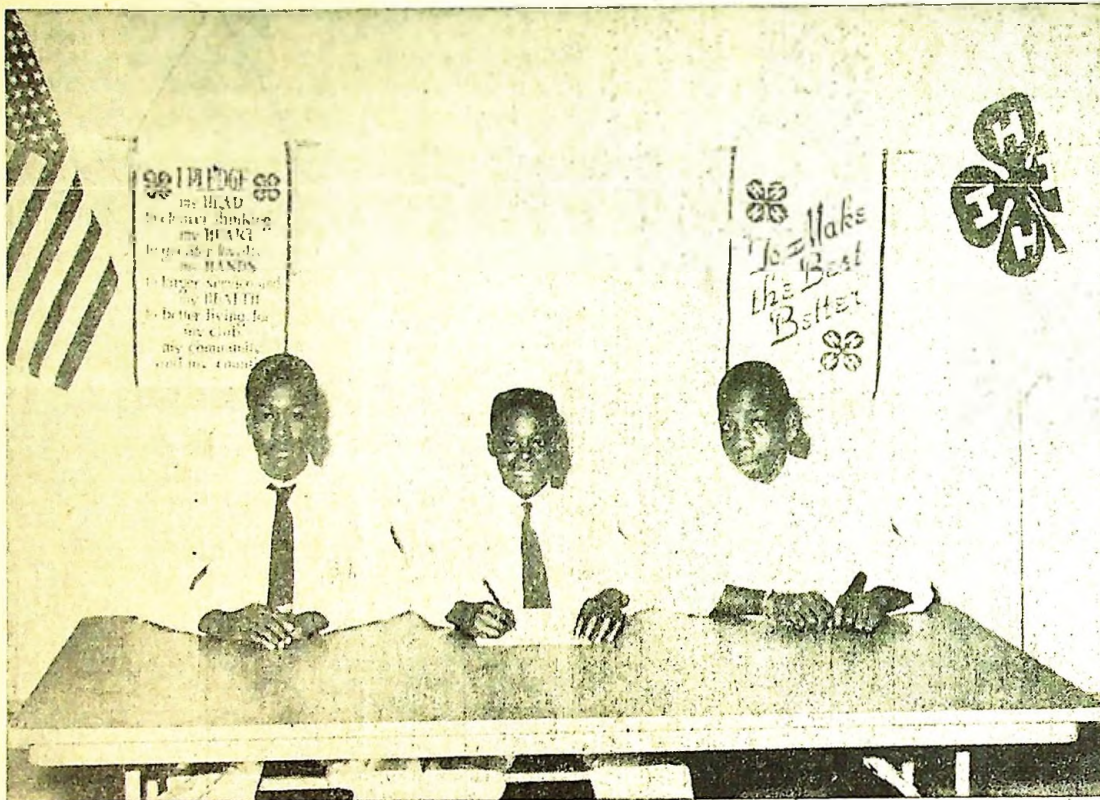

Three brush control demonstrations were visited this month by the Agent, twelve adults and eighteen 4-H boys. These visits were made in the Redland, Chireno and Douglass Communities. The purpose of the group visitation were for them to see the effectiveness of the kill and to explain mixtures of each chemical. The demonstration in the Chireno community was on the Skillers farm. The plot was sprayed with three cups of 2,4,5-T in nine gallons of diseal oil, for the control of the hornbean. This operations were 95% effective. The second demonstration visited was on the Mills farm in the Redland Community. Three acres of sprouts and stumps were sprayed with Reddon 8 cups to 12 gal. of diseal oil. This plot was 84% effective. Douglass community on Henry Scott farm one acre was sprayed with esteron 99-four cups in six gal. diseal oil. This plot was 75% effective. Each demonstrator plans to enlarge their plots to control hard wood and weeds, there by making more land available for pastures,
