Johnnie Grisby in the Eden community is assisting farmers in culling and mixing rations for their herds. Hay is of poor quality this year and too high for its present feed value. Farmers are grinding their corn and mixing 41% cotton seed meal. This mixture is encouraged to reduced feed cost.

Livestock producers are making application to the A.S.C. office for grain and other feeds made available through the Government at reduced prices to supplement the feed they have on hand.

Corn at present is selling for \$1.75 per bu. and grass hay \$1.40 per bale, however most of the families feel that they will have an adequate feed supply on hand to carry them through out the winter, after their herds have been reduced.

In order to assist these families in making wise use of their home grown feeds, news letters are being mailed to them on proper mixing of home grown feeds and suggesting in purchasing feeds to supplement what they have on hand.

The farm management subcommittee are making plans to assist farmers throughout the county in planning for their overall farm and home operations by keeping records and analyzing each enterprise to determine it value in the total farming operation. Tim Shepard is chairman.
